PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear CLPS Parents and Caregivers,

April already! I found that those 5 weeks of March went by very quickly! And even though it is April, it still looks a little more like March outside. Regardless, spring has arrived and I am certainly looking forward to the warmer temperatures that are sure to come! With that said, even though spring is approaching, we are still in that strange transition period where it is quite chilly in the morning and quite mild in the afternoon, and all four seasons can manifest during the course of the day. Therefore, it is still important that students come to school dressed for the weather, with a jacket and hat/toque at least.

The month of April will be both a short, yet full, month: Kindergarten to Grade 8 Oratory happens the week of April 4th to 14th – with the finalist assemblies on April 12th; SCC Taco-in-a-bag hot lunch is April 7th; P4A basketball Extravaganza happens the week of April 11th; CLPS Earth Day is the afternoon of April 14th, put on by the Grade 7/8 class; and Easter Break is from April 15th to 24th.

Lastly, I would like to take a moment to briefly write about the importance of regular school attendance. Students being in class each and every day is of vital importance to their academic success. It may be difficult to see in the moment or short term, but research repeatedly shows that regular absences (1-2 times a week) begin to erode away at our students' opportunity to build skill in reading, writing, and mathematics. This creates a gap in learning that only widens with continued and ongoing absenteeism. Parents can encourage their children to attend daily by:

• Setting regular bedtime and morning routines

- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before
- Know that sometimes complaints of sore stomachs and headaches are signs of anxiety
- Talk with teachers, school counsellor, and/or administration for advice on how to alleviate a child's anxiety about going to school or other issues.

• Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.

As always, my office is always open for a discussion around questions or concerns that you may have. Thank you for your ongoing partnership in the education of our students here at CLPS!





Cindy enjoys her ever expanding family, her walk with Christ, and the beauty of nature that surrounds her.





(98 minutes, PG) After discovering a small, blue, fast hedgehog, a small-town police officer must help him defeat an evil genius who wants to do experiments on him.


April 22 – Tom and Jerry: The Movie


April 23 - Clifford the Big Red Dog
