Cell Phones

At Christopher Lake Public School, we acknowledge that cell phones have the potential to be a great academic tool, as well as the potential to be a great distraction. We, therefore, seek to find a productive balance in the following cell phone protocol at our school. We expect that when

students disembark from the buses at the beginning of the day, cell phones will be set to silent and stored. Cell phones should not be in use on the playground, hallways, or washrooms at CLPS. This will include having earbuds in and connected to the one's cell phone. We believe that recess times are an important part of social learning and interaction, and that using earbuds impedes this aspect of social development with one's peers.

Because cell phones can be a great classroom resource, students will be invited, at times, by their classroom teacher to use their cell phone in class. At the conclusion of the class, the classroom teacher will instruct students to again silence and store their cell phones. When it comes to ensuring that this important protocol is observed, the following steps will be taken when a student is found using their cell phone when they are not supposed to be:

- **First Time** – The staff member will be given the cell phone, and it will be returned to the student at the end of the day.
- **Second Time** – The staff member will be given the cell phone, and it will be kept in the Principal's office for the day. A call will be made to the student's parents. The phone will be returned to the student at the end of the day.
- **Third Time** – The staff member will be given the cell phone, and it will be kept in the Principal's office for the day. A call will be made to the student's parents for ***them to retrieve the cell phone at their convenience.***

NUT FREE SCHOOL

Once again we are going to keep our school completely **NUT** free. This is to protect our students who have severe allergies. Please do not send any foods that contains even a trace amount of nuts to school in your child's lunch. STUDENT FEES

All students from Kindergarten to Grade 8 must pay a \$30.00 student fee. This fee will be used to purchase materials that support student learning in the classroom. Please note: The school will accept fees in monthly installments.

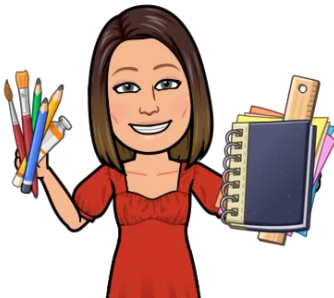
Grade 8 – Mrs. Liedtke

Dear Parents/Guardians:

LETTER OF FAIR NOTICE – Violence, Threat and Risk Assessment Protocol

The Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division Board (SRPSD) is committed to providing safe learning environments for all students, staff, school visitors and community members. We believe that by working together with students, their families, and the community we can support young people to be healthy and happy.

Our principals, vice-principals and school social workers have received Level One and/or Two training in Violence Threat/Risk Assessment (VTRA). This training has lead to the development of a community protocol to help principals protect students from potential threats to safety or serious harm. The protocol helps schools respond quickly to threatening incidents.

The Prince Albert Community VTRA Protocol outlines how schools will respond to threatening or worrisome behavior. Principals will convene a School Threat Assessment Team, which typically will include the principal/vice-principal, a school counselor and a police officer. Depending on the severity of the potential threat, principals may also consult with the Superintendent of Schools and call in members of the Community Threat Assessment Team. This Community Team may include representatives of community agencies such as local Police, Mental Health and Addiction Services, or Child and Family Services.

Parents and guardians will be notified as soon as possible in the VTRA process. If parents/guardians cannot be reached or if they choose not to provide consent, the threat assessment may still proceed. Personal information shared throughout this process will respect and balance each individual's right to privacy with the need to ensure the safety of all.

This letter is to serve fair notice that SRPSD will take decisive action when a serious threat has been made. Our goal, as always, is to ensure student safety in a caring learning environment.
